The South Wales Fire and Rescue Services, REFLECT Project is building partnerships throughout South Wales in order to successfully educate and build awareness around the Fire Services key messages with young people aged between 11-25.

The project aims to raise awareness of the consequences of actions by engaging with children and young people in a targeted approach.

Did you know?

Statistics indicate that young people aged 11-25 are at high risk of being killed or seriously injured on our roads or being involved in Fire Setting behaviour:

The main aim is to help reduce young peoples' likelihood of involvement in antisocial or offending behaviour, including:

Reducing the number of Arson attacks, deliberate fires and fire related anti-social behaviour, such as attacks on Fire Fighters and hoax calls.

Work in partnership with external Agencies, Services, and local Fire Stations to target areas of need as identified through intelligence. Work with young people who may be at risk of being involved in anti-social or offending behaviour.

Educate Children and Young People' about the consequences of their actions and how situations that they may find themselves in could impact on themselves their family and their community.

To reduce number of fatalities involving young drivers and passengers, or those involved in vehicle crime.

To reduce number of young people from entering or re-entering the Criminal Justice System.

Objectives

The REFLECT Project has the flexibility to tailor interventions to the needs of individual groups.

Use prior knowledge to explain links between cause and effect and make predictions.

- Take different perspectives into account when making informed decisions and choices effectively.
- Communicate complex views and express opinions in a wide range of situations through a range of appropriate methods.
- Appreciate, reflect on and evaluate other points of view and respond appropriately.

- Be assertive and resist unwanted peer pressure and other influences.
- Evaluate and access a range of local and national sources of information, support and advice confidently.
- Develop the practical skills necessary for everyday life.
- Educate and increase their understanding of all aspects of personal and social development and well-being
- Develop respect for themselves and others.
- Develop a consistent set of personal values and have the confidence to apply these in practice.
- Actively demonstrate personal responsibility as a global citizen.


Objectives

MAIN ACTIVITIES

Emphasis that Fire Crime, Anti-Social Behaviour and Vehicle Crime have a knock on effect, and consideration of their actions is needed.

Workshops

South Wales Fire and Rescue Service are committed to making our communities the safest places to live, work and visit.

To achieve this we have developed a flexible approach to enhance our engagement with our partners, communities and children and young people.

The project is part of that approach and seeks to educate and inform young people about the hazards associated with fire, road safety, water safety and the wider issues surrounding community and personal safety.

REFLECT GROUP WORKSHOPS:

Delivered from a variety of venues including partnership services and agencies premises and Fire Stations.

Run between 1 - 6 hours. The number of hours delivered is dependent on group needs.

Delivered in Welsh Unitary Authorities known for Deliberate Fire Setting, Vehicle Crime and high incidents of Attacks on Fire Crew and False and Malicious Calls.

Available through a variety of delivery tools such as interactive DVD's, group discussion, peer review, and real life

incidents/case Studies. (Lesson plans for workshop available on request).

Evaluation is a key element of the REFLECT project with the possibility of children and young people being monitored pre and post intervention to identify any behavioural and/or attitude change.

- To challenge negative decision making processes
- To develop healthier attributes of a young person

A dedicated team work closely with the children and young people and using a restorative approach.

ACTIVITIES INCLUDE:

- Dam Building, and Search and Rescue
- Problem Solvingy

Valuable insight is gained into the role of a Fire Fighter

Young people leave with an increased knowledge into:

- The consequences and dangers of deliberate Fire Setting and Road Safety issues;
- · How to live and work safely
- An increased sense of self worth
- Improved interpersonal skills
- Increased sense of self respect

Pop up / Doorstep Sports

REFLECT project Pop Up/Doorstep Sports is a sporting and activity based social inclusion intervention.

Pop Up/Doorstep Sport provides a vibrant and varied sporting opportunity to young people in disadvantaged communities that are designed to grow their motivation.



Sport and physical activity has an important role in youth crime prevention, with the aim to offer positive alternatives to substance misuse and anti-social behaviour.

This is a national effort to test the most effective ways to empower disadvantaged young people to feel comfortable in their living environment and a way for them to look at taking ownership of the areas in which they live.

REFLECT use this sporting method as a positive way of engagement, working closing with partnerships as part of delivery

Group workshops follow on from initial sporting engagement.

Evaluation

The REFLECT Project utilises what is known as a Young Persons Assessment (YPA) form

The assessment process is designed to find out the risk and protective factors playing a part in a young person's behaviour and ways of thinking which allows the project to evaluate behaviour and attitude change prior to delivery and at completion of delivery.

The YPA's help provide an indication of the types of intervention needed.

Findings are shared with referring agencies/services on request and following the signing of a South Wales Fire and Rescue Service, Memorandum of Understanding.

2020/2021 findings indicated an:

80+%
decrease in

90+% increase in Positive Attitude Change.
