WALES SAFEGUARDING REPOSITORY UPDATE

- The WSR team carried out testing of the repository with stakeholders from a range of organisations on key functions (logging in, searching etc).
- The overall response was positive with some helpful feedback and suggestions that will be used to inform 2023/24 developments.
- One user said they felt it is a 'system safeguarding has been hoping for' for a long time, and others thought the WSR could also be used as part of training (for Boards as well as students in social work and nursing).

The final report is then used to inform professional practice via the Wales Safeguarding Repository.

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PROGRESS TO DATE

- Mid and West Wales Regional Safeguarding Board have been awarded a grant from Welsh Gov and are now working to develop and deliver the SUSR Learning and Development Programme, with training planned to commence for chairs and reviewers across Wales late in the year in readiness for SUSR implementation
- Law firm Geldards LLP have been commissioned to identify a new legal footing to enable better sharing of information between organisations for the purposes of undertaking an SUSR. This aims to address current barriers identified, particularly relating to requests for patient information from health partners.
