SUSR TRAINING PROGRAMME UPDATE

- First pilot session for Panel members was delivered on the 19th February with Chairs and Reviewers training being delivered on the 7th and 8th March 2024. Once the pilots have been completed and reviewed full training will be scheduled for delivery from April to September 2024.
- Please submit nominations to be placed on the Approved Chairs and Reviewers list to then receive training

Create a single review process where a multiagency approach is required, incorporating the following review processes Adult Practice **Review; Child Practice Review**; Domestic Homicide Review: Mental Health Homicide Review; Offensive Weapon Homicide Review. The final report is then used to inform professional practice via the Wales Safeguarding Repository.

PROGRESS TO DATE

- The Statutory Guidance is with Welsh Government Legal Department for final check.
- SUSR (Offensive Weapon) pilots are being progressed. The qualifying pilot period has ended with 1 review in Cwm Taf and 1 awaiting a decision in Cardiff.
- Letter sent from Deputy Minister of Social Services to Home Office Minister to utilise SUSR processes for quality assurance purposes rather than the Home Office QA Panel for domestic homicide related SUSRs.
- Report submitted to DMSS on funding options for Reviewers /Chairs

WALES SAFEGUARDING REPOSITORY UPDATE

Work has commenced on preparing the WSR User Registration process including the identification of a domain name and addressing accessibility issues



NEXT STEPS

- The data protection aspects are being addressed in relation to comments received from the Information Commissioners Office.
- Changes are now being considered to Working Together Volume 1.

VICTIM AND FAMILY REFERENCE GROUP

The Victim and Family Reference Group continue to meet to progress a way forward on the engagement process. It has been agreed that an indicative flowchart should be created to illustrate the key engagements points

LEARNING FROM OTHERS

 Learning from the Cardiff SUSR pilot (Mental Health/Domestic)will be captured to determine if any changes are required to the Statutory Guidance prior to it being finalised.
