The Scale of the Problem

Under Climate change predictions, Wales is anticipated to have decreased summer precipitation and increased summer temperatures, increasing the risk of Wildfires each year.

Annual Grass Fires since 2015 (Jan to Sep 30)

Overall the number of Grass fires have increased by 1,244 an increase of 64% to 3191



Deliberate grass fire up from 1489 to 2209 (48% increase) from 2021 compared with 2022



All Grass Fires since 2015









Copurnicus - Effis Active Fires Map


